




Knox Rd is at the bottom of a dip in the road and can be hard to see but there will be a sign pointing out the turn. Knox Rd is gravel over very old pavement. It is uneven and a bit narrow. After turning onto Knox Rd, drive up a hill to a T-intersection and turn right. This is still technically Knox Rd, but it will now turn to dirt/gravel.

After about 0.3 miles turn left into the club. Drive through the gate towards the sign that says “Columbus Beagle Club” and follow the road to the left up the hill, past two old barns. Stay left when the road forks (the better traveled road) and you will be in the parking area. Find yourself a nice grassy area to set up!



GENERAL RULE OF THUMB: Up until Knox road, everything along the correct route is a two lane, paved, flat and even road. Knox road is gravel, but used to be paved (up until recently; they just poured the gravel over the old, cracked, uneven pavement). It is a bit narrow, uneven, and has no dividing line. Once you turn right at the T-intersection at the top of the hill, the road turns gravel over dirt. You only go 0.3 miles before turning into the club. So MOST of your drive should be on paved, flat, even roads with at least two lanes (one lane for each direction of travel).

If you turn onto a one lane, narrow, uneven, gravel, or dirt road that is not Knox road, you missed something! If you are on a gravel/dirt road for more than about a mile, and have not turned into the club and gone through a gate, something has gone wrong!

Some crazy places other people's GPS systems have taken them:

DO NOT take Hwy 52A or Hwy 525 off of Hwy 33. This can eventually spit you back out on Hwy 93 and get you to the club (if you don't make some other questionable turn) but it is not fun.

DO NOT turn left on Scotts Creek Road from Hwy 93 (about a mile from Hwy 33). This will put you on a narrow, one-lane gravel road. You will get to the club...eventually....

DO NOT turn left on Walhonding Ave from Hwy 93 (just before Kachelmacher Park in Logan). This road meets up with Scotts Creek and turns into Calico Ridge Rd. Maybe a nice scenic country drive on narrow dirt roads...if you don't need to worry about getting to the trial any time that day....

DO NOT turn onto any road that has signs indicating it is closed during inclement weather.
